Introducing Yourself "My name is..." / "I am from..." - Personal pronouns (I, you, he/she, we, they) - Key verbs: być (to be), mieć (to have) - Countries and nationalities - Occupations / jobs 3. Numbers and Basic Questions - Numbers 0–100 - Asking simple questions (How? Where? Who?) - Common question words: co, gdzie, kto, kiedy. 4. Use basic vocabulary related to: - Daily routines - Food and shopping - Directions and travel - Clothing, colors, and personality traits Recognize and apply basic grammar structures, such as: - Present tense of regular verbs - Key verbs: być (to be), mieć (to have) - Possessive pronouns (my, your, his/her) - Simple prepositions (do, na, w)
